About Us

Three Campuses, One College

We are a multi-site, co-educational secondary college in Melbourne's inner west, dedicated to learning excellence in an engaged, faith-filled and supportive environment. Students learn in a single-sex environment during their formative years at separate all-girls and all-boys campuses, before moving to our senior co-educational campus.

Christ the King Campus Years 7 - 9 girls

St John's Campus Years 7 - 9 boys

Sacred Heart Campus Years 10 - 12 co-educational

Caroline Chisholm Catholic College was established in 1997 when our three foundation schools, with roots stretching back more than 65 years, merged together. We honour the Brothers of the Sacred Heart, Religious Sisters of the Sacred Heart, parents, priests and parishioners who worked tirelessly to establish Christ the King College, St John's College and Chisholm College, enabling the children of Melbourne's inner west to access a Catholic education.

Caroline Chisholm

Caroline Chisholm was not only a social reformer and advocate for the most vulnerable, she was also a visionary, leader, canny political operator and feminist as well as being a wife and mother.

Arriving in Australia, Caroline was appalled by the terrible plight of many of the young women who arrived from Britain with little food, money or understanding of their new home, so with moral courage she took on the establishment. Beginning in a small cottage, Caroline welcomed these young girls, providing them with shelter and training. She set up a school and an employment agency to find positions for new arrivals, settling over 11,000 young women. She fought to set a minimum wage, work contracts and founded employment agencies in dozens of rural centres. Caroline accommodated multicultural families through her shelter sheds which were built on crown land in the western regions of Melbourne during the Gold Rush.

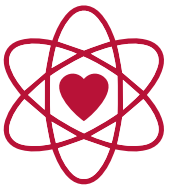
LEARNING DIVERSITY

With love at the core, we strive to instil self-discipline and to ensure respect is a priority in all relationships. Faith in Action

Our social justice programs invite students to support the vulnerable in our community and to understand the injustices within our social structures. Guided by our Social Justice Committee, students actively live out their faith through service, fundraising and advocacy. Regular fundraising is conducted to support charities, while volunteering opportunities such as the Maidstone Reading Club allow students to contribute directly to the community. Key initiatives like the Vinnies Winter Sleepout raise awareness and funds for homelessness. Together, these activities help students integrate faith into daily life through meaningful action and compassionate engagement.

The College takes up the challenge issued by the late Pope Francis to protect our common home and to bring humanity together to seek a sustainable and equitable way forward for future generations.

Sustainability

These days provide students with the opportunity to deepen their spiritual self and their relationship with God. It aims to give students a deep respect for the value of personal story and a search for religious meaning within the context of their lives and the life of our faith community.

House System

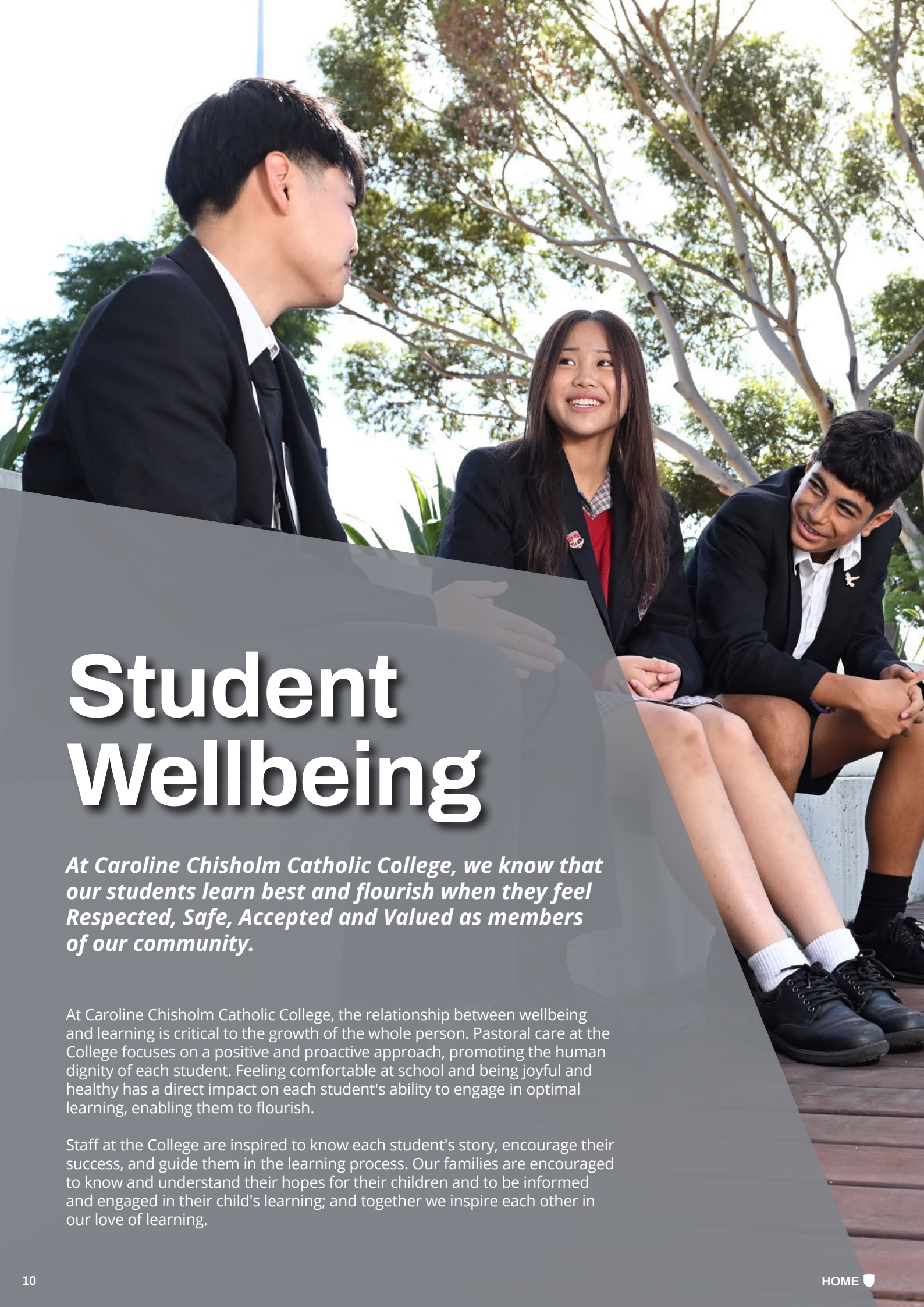

Our four Houses - Ambrose, Clare, Galgani and Lorenzo - are named after saints who are remembered for their work with the poor, and their positive impact on society.

Family Support

Caroline Chisholm Catholic College recognises that the growth of every young person is strengthened through genuine partnerships between families and the College. Ensuring families have clear access to information, support and our College processes is essential to joint success.

To foster these relationships, our dedicated Family Partnership Team guides and supports the vital connection between home and school. They provide parent engagement opportunities, language assistance, uniform and resource support and community building programs. With the expertise of our Multicultural Education Assistance team, we also offer support in a variety of languages, creating an inclusive community where every family feels they belong.



Student Wellbeing

At Caroline Chisholm Catholic College, we know that our students learn best and flourish when they feel Respected, Safe, Accepted and Valued as members of our community.

At Caroline Chisholm Catholic College, the relationship between wellbeing and learning is critical to the growth of the whole person. Pastoral care at the College focuses on a positive and proactive approach, promoting the human dignity of each student. Feeling comfortable at school and being joyful and healthy has a direct impact on each student's ability to engage in optimal learning, enabling them to flourish.

Staff at the College are inspired to know each student's story, encourage their success, and guide them in the learning process. Our families are encouraged to know and understand their hopes for their children and to be informed and engaged in their child's learning; and together we inspire each other in our love of learning.

Learner Mentor

The Learner Mentor Program acts as the foundation for facilitating relationships between students, staff and parents/carers. They serve as coaches, mentors, guides and role models. They facilitate an open relationship, aiming to assist the students holistically and academically.

Our families are seen as partners and are encouraged to know and understand their hopes for their children and be informed and engaged in their child's learning; and together we inspire each other in our love of learning.

Personal Development Program

Our Learner Mentor sessions include a pastoral program that is uniquely tailored to Caroline Chisholm Catholic College. This program is known as the Personal Development Program and sees students explore a range of skills each year known as 'Our Five Pillars'. The program aims to acknowledge the challenges facing our young people today, as well as ensuring a connection to faith and the Catholic tradition.

Student Support

COUNSELLING

Caroline Chisholm Catholic College is committed to providing a safe environment and assisting students to develop appropriate skills and attitudes to resolve problems in academic, psychological, emotional and social contexts.

Our College provides students with access to counsellors who are readily available to all students. These professional services are made available to all students at no cost. Our team is also available to discuss concerns with parents and carers regarding their child by request.

STUDENT SERVICES

Both sites host a dedicated student services desk, operating from 8am - 4pm. This is a central place for students to go to for medical attention, questions and general communication.

STUDENT LIAISON TEAM

The Student Liaison Team is a student focused support service who works alongside the Wellbeing Team to increase student engagement throughout the College and within the wider community.

The main focuses of the program include:

- To create social spaces equipped with interactive resources such as board games, connect four and many more
- Provide the Afterschool Program and Homework Club on Wednesday afternoons
- Facilitate school holiday programs for community connections
- Coordinate student leadership programs through partner organisations such as the Western Bulldogs
- General student wellbeing support, mentorship and guidance.



Learning

Education opens many pathways. The College provides a broad and holistic curriculum that aims to engage and challenge our students and demand excellence of them whilst developing their mind, body and spirit. We hope the broad educational perspectives provided at Caroline Chisholm Catholic College will encourage students to discover and pursue individual interests and pathways. We equip students with critical thinking and communication skills required of them to become productive members of an ever-changing community.

Subject Offerings

The College offers a range of core and elective subjects at junior levels which provides students with experiences in a variety of subjects. This ensures they have the skills and knowledge required to choose their individual pathways in their senior years.

Years 7-9 Pathways

Our Years 7–9 program is designed to give students broad access to a wide range of subjects and learning experiences within a supportive single-sex setting. This variety allows students to explore their interests, discover their strengths and develop the foundational skills that will guide their future learning.

Students in Years 7 and 8 complete core subjects including: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Religion, Health and Physical Education and a Language (or Literacy). They also participate in a rotation of elective subjects such as Music, Drama, Food Technology, Textiles, Visual Arts, Robotics and Product Design. Each elective is completed across two years, enabling students to experience diverse learning areas and identify their emerging passions.

In Year 9, students have greater capacity to select additional electives, helping them refine their interests and build confidence as they begin shaping their senior program. This structure fosters engagement, curiosity and a strong sense of direction as students progress toward their future studies, empowering them to make confident and informed decisions about their senior pathways at the College.

Years 10-12 Pathways

The Years 10 - 12 learning and teaching program at Caroline Chisholm Catholic College offers a variety of study options and numerous pathways.

Year 10 is designed to provide a foundation for future study and strengthen student's ability to plan their future pathways. Select students can extend their learning and study Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) subjects at Year 10.

VCE

We offer a wide range and variety of VCE subjects that provide our senior students with a breadth of choice and opportunity. Additionally, students with strong academic abilities can study university level subjects while still at school.

VCE VM

The Victorian Certificate of Education - Vocational Major (VCE VM) is an alternative pathway, which runs parallel to VCE. It is a hands-on option for Year 11 and 12 students and provides practical, work-related experiences in both the classroom and workplace settings. The College offers a robust VCE VM program that is supported by dedicated teachers and collaborative partnerships.

VET

The College offers Vocational Educational and Training (VET) units that deliver workplace specific skills and knowledge-based competencies. The curriculum and assessments in these programs are based on the skills and knowledge needed to undertake tasks for a specific industry.

Students undertaking VET units gain a nationally recognised qualification and earn credits towards completion of their VCE or VCE VM program.

Some VET certificates are offered onsite at the College and as part of the College timetable*, including certificates in:

- Applied Fashion Design and Technology
- Applied Languages
- Community Services
- Health Services Assistance
- Laboratory Skills
- Music Performance
- Small Business
- Sport and Recreation

The College also offers the opportunity for students to study VET certificates off-campus at local registered training organisations (RTOs), such as TAFEs, universities or other Secondary Colleges.

Tutoring

The College offers group tutoring for all students throughout the school year with support in literacy and numeracy as key areas. There are additional one-on-one or group tutoring opportunities by learning areas throughout the year and in the lead up to exams.

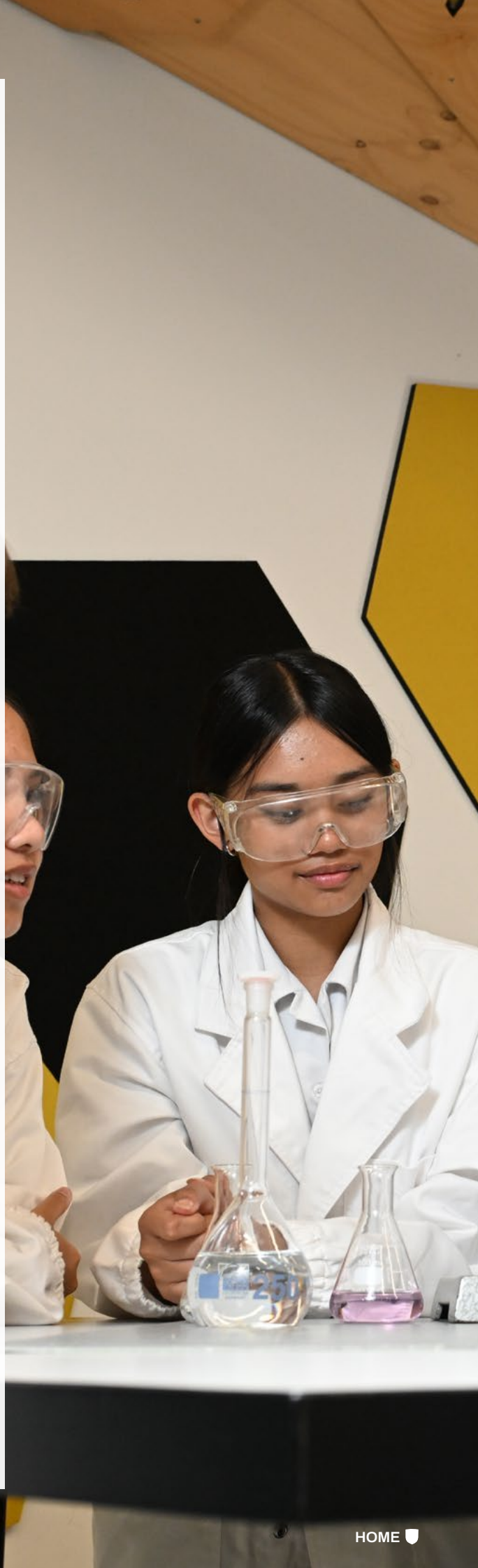
Whether students are heading towards tertiary study, a traineeship, apprenticeship or employment, the Pathways Centre can offer professional advice and assistance in the following areas:

College Programs

Aspire

Aspire is Caroline Chisholm Catholic College's educational enrichment program for students in Years 7 - 9. Aspire enables dedicated and high achieving students to be challenged and provides opportunities for learning acceleration while promoting a range of personal and academic skills.

The program is designed for students who share a passion and commitment to learning, have exceptional abilities across multiple disciplines and are highly motivated to reach their full potential.

Aspire is accessed by invitation and based on academic testing and an application process after students have been offered a position at the College. Details are provided to families when students are in Grade 6.

Sports Academy

Caroline Chisholm's Sports Academy is a dynamic program designed to support and develop talented student athletes. It provides a unique pathway for students to pursue high performance sport while maintaining academic excellence in a structured and supportive environment.

The program offers specialised coaching, strength and conditioning sessions, nutrition workshops and performance monitoring. There is a tailored curriculum that nurtures long-term athlete development and equips students with key skills in leadership, teamwork and individual goal setting. Whether students are focused on one or multiple sports, our Sports Academy Program promotes continual growth and is designed to challenge, support and empower students to thrive both as athletes and as students.

Encore Music

Caroline Chisholm Catholic College offers a unique program that allows students who already learn or have learnt an instrument to focus on learning an instrument from the woodwind, brass, strings or percussion family.

The Encore program runs for two years in Years 7 and 8, and for the duration of the program, students will be issued an instrument to take home and practice. They will be tutored in class by specialist music teachers on their selected instrument.

Camps & Outdoor Education

Our Outdoor Education program promotes student's personal development while encouraging teamwork and positive attitudes towards the environment. All students in Years 7 - 9 participate in camps and safely build on their skills year-by-year under the supervision of our qualified and experienced outdoor education staff.

Activities undertaken include camping, hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, cooking, rock climbing and surfing.

Study Tours

The College offers a range of International and Domestic Study Tours that enrich the students learning beyond the classroom. Our International Study Tours to Italy and Japan provide immersive experiences that deepen the students understanding of the language and culture they study. For Year 10 students, the Central Australia Study Tour offers a unique opportunity to engage with the rich history, culture and landscapes of our own country.



Co-Curricular

Performing Arts

The Performing Arts enable students to develop their creative and expressive capacities by learning about the different practices, disciplines and traditions that have shaped the expression of culture locally, nationally and globally.

Our annual College musical showcases our students' performing abilities, as well as their backstage and front of house talents. Our musicals are student-led and all year levels are encouraged to get involved. Participating in the College musical enables students to experience the world of staged productions firsthand and get to know like-minded students.

Sports

Sport and physical activity are an integral part of our holistic education, helping students build leadership, teamwork, sportsmanship and perseverance. As members of the Sports Association of Catholic Co-educational Secondary Schools (SACCSS) and School Sport Victoria, our students have the opportunity to compete against other schools and pursue premiership success across a wide range of sports, including swimming, golf, futsal and cross-country, this can even lead to regional, state or even national representation.

We are committed to offering diverse sporting experiences, with compulsory swimming in Years 7, 8 and 9 as part of the Physical Education program. Closer to home, students can showcase their talents and challenge themselves at the College's annual athletics carnival and other school sporting events.



Music

Engagement with music can make a significant contribution to wellbeing as well as academic progress. At Caroline Chisholm Catholic College, we believe that learning to play an instrument and appreciate music is important for all students. Our programs are designed to provide a meaningful and fulfilling introduction to the art of performing, listening and composing. We provide students with opportunities within our extensive music program, including classroom music, instrumental music lessons, ensemble and band opportunities, VCE and VET music programs and our Encore program.

The College offers lessons in a range of instrument families, including:

- Voice
- Woodwind

Debating

The Debating program at the College is yet another way students can engage in co-curricular fields. Participants can compete regularly in Debaters Association Victoria events and are coached by passionate staff members, who are eager to assist students in their growth as speakers and support them in the experiences that arise.

A myriad of clubs of interest are available at the College. Ranging from Robotics club and sociology club to our passionate Eco Committee, Vinnies Social Justice group and various music ensembles - just to name a few. Facilities

The College enjoys modern facilities which include a 6-lane indoor swimming pool, 820-seat auditorium, two libraries, a trade training centre, modern science labs, fully equipped music rooms, advanced visual arts wing, cafeterias, expansive sports grounds including basketball courts, a state-of-the-art gym, and a dedicated creative arts centre.

The College also has dedicated spaces and buildings, including the Blessed Benedict Daswa Hall completed in 2022, to hold a wide variety of events for our College community.

Our Sacred Heart Campus includes a senior study centre with a multi-use kitchenette for senior students to enjoy. The College also has space in our Archibald Learning Centre that caters to students with learning diversities.

Garema Dumont is Caroline Chisholm Catholic College's 56-acre outdoor and environmental education facility located in a native bush land setting along the banks of the Moorabool River in the Brisbane Ranges. The Moorabool River provides opportunities for canoeing, kayaking, rafting and

swimming. The property also has high and low ropes courses, a rockclimbing tower, archery field, bush tucker garden as well as a range of mountain biking tracks. On-site facilities include a newly renovated dining hall and kitchen, amenities with toilets and hot showers as well as a barbeque and campfire area. As a sustainable facility Garema Dumont produces renewable energy through wind and solar power and promotes minimal impact practices.

The College is also looking forward to the construction of a new STEM building, scheduled to begin in 2026. This state-of-the-art facility will include additional classrooms as well as specialised spaces, such as a commercial-standard hospitality centre and a 300-seat exam hall.

Transport

A College shuttle bus operates between our two sites - 65 and 204 Churchill Avenue. This assists students who have scheduled classes at the different campuses during the day.

Enrolment Process

It is vital to apply for Year 7 when your child is in Grade 5. Applications for Year 7 close mid-August each year.

1. Complete an enrolment application form.

Visit www.cccc.vic.edu.au to access and complete our online Application Form.

2. Submit your completed application form.

Ensure you provide all required documents with the application. A non-refundable application fee is required at the time of submission. Applications close mid-August each year.

3. The College will conduct interviews of all applicants.

Families will be invited to attend an enrolment interview with a senior staff member of the College after the application deadline.

4. Enrolment and waiting list offers will be sent to families.

Families will be notified of any offer after the interview process.

Please note that enrolments for Year 7 are processed by the College when your child is in Grade 5, and not prior.

For enrolments outside this period, applications follow steps 1 and 2 above and students are placed on a waiting list. When a position becomes available the waitlist is reviewed and the College will begin the interview process with the prospective family.

Democratic Principles Statement
